Regular Verbs

With regular verbs, we simply add -ed to the end of the base verb to change it from the present to the past simple tense.

Examples

- ◆ They accepted the agreement.
- ◆ Julie helped me finish the project.

♦ We talked about that idea.

• The company invented a new product.

Irregular Verbs

Irregular verbs do not follow the -ed rule. They have unique forms that you need to memorize. Here are some of the most common irregular verbs.
