

# More to Learn

#### Here are more useful expressions for asking about the tours. Practice them with a partner.

- 1. A: How much is this historical tour?
  - B: It costs 120 euros per person. But if you both sign up, I can give it to you for 100 each.
- 2. A: How long does the tour last?
  - B: Almost the whole day. So don't plan on doing something else.
- 3. A: When does the tour start and finish?
  - B: We usually depart at eight in the morning and come back around five in the afternoon, depending on the traffic.
- 4. A: What does the tour fee include?
  - B: It includes the full day of transportation and a Tuscan-style lunch at a nice restaurant in Siena.
